Sports Premium

At Purford Green Primary school, we pride ourselves on the quality of our P.E. curriculum, the wealth of opportunities given to pupils to participate in competitive sports and games and the wide range of sporting activities offered in lessons and clubs. In March 2013, the Government determined to pay a 'ring-fenced sport premium' to all primary schools to enable each school to 'improve the quality and breadth of its PE and sporting provision'. The sum received by Purford Green School for the academic year 2022-2023 was £17,720 (£16,000 + £1,800 (£10 per pupil)). The total spent on Sports during 2022/2023 is £23,432.42.

The 5 key indicators where improvements should be seen are:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, aiming for 30 minutes a day within school time.
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

The National Curriculum aims:

- Develop competence to excel in a broad range of physical activities
- Are physically active for sustained periods of time
- Engage in competitive sports and activities
- Lead healthy, active lives.

The table below shows how the allocated funding for **2022-2023** was utilized and the impact expenditure has had on enhancing sporting provision in terms of learning outcomes, engagement, sporting success and pupil well-being.

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Platinum Sports Mark Awarded for the first time. • We attended competitions provided by the Harlow SGO and overall participation in competition has risen. More friendly matches and learning festivals were organized this year, providing further opportunities. Due to the increase in participation and competition, we have had occasions where B and C teams have taken part. These included events specifically for pupils with SEND and those identified as Gifted and Talented. During covid, we hosted and attended virtual competitions. • New equipment has been purchased to teach and include new sports. • Over 98% of pupils and staff now have logoed PE tops that are in their house colours, making it easier for intra-school competitions. • New equipment was purchased to allow safe PE teaching • Virtual tournaments were launched and run during lockdowns and remote learning. Virtual Tournaments are still used throughout Intraschool competitions. • The Sports Reps' are taking an active role with leading warm ups and helping with equipment. • A Key Stage 2 survey successfully identifies those children not taking part in any physical activity outside of school. These children were then targeted for our Change4Life club. • An annual sports day was held, which involved all the school and was an opportunity for competition for all abilities. We ran it in one day with pupils wearing their house colours. We had Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 house winners. • Sporting clubs monitored throughout the year for attendance and new clubs introduced where year group attendance is lower. New clubs started and clubs expanded to cater for more children. • School's own mini-bus used to provide transport to every competition and swimming sessions. This has helped ensure the children all arrive safely and reduces the issue of transport and parents not being able to drive. During Covid, when this was not possible, the minibus was used for supporting families with food packs and resources. • Pupils have been targeted for after school clubs with funding provided for those attending teams. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Investment in sporting equipment to train for new tournaments) • Increase the use of the minibus, sharing resources with the other primary schools in the trust. • Look at targeting students more efficiently. Sports reps will be introduced to the new method of collecting evidence to help support staff. We will be using iPads to capture videos and pictures. • Increase Inter School Competitions • Increase girl take up of sports. • Continue swimming for Year 6 23/24 to increase number of children who can swim 25m

Membership/Kit has been supplied to a pupil in year 5 for the local rugby club. • Membership paid for a Child in year 4 to attend Karate club for 2 terms. • Achieved award for KS1 PE for the second time running. (Each award lasts 2 years). • Links with trust schools has helped increase intra-school competition and support for travel and tournaments. • Increase in Girls Only tournaments and the number of girls attending clubs. • Sponsorship has provided a new kit for pupils to wear at competitions. • Sports leader tops have been purchased to identify the sports leaders easily.
