Dear Parents and Carers,

It was lovely to see so many parents and children attend our parent consultation meetings in October. We are delighted that almost every child in our school had a family member attend an appointment with their class teacher, and the children have had the opportunity to show you all that they have been learning so far this term. This half term is proving to be a very busy one, with many exciting trips and visits planned. Already, Year 3 have had the privilege of immersing themselves in the world of theatre with a visit to London to see the stage show Matilda. Meanwhile, Year 4 have been to the cinema, and Year 1 have enjoyed a memorable seaside excursion to Walton on the Naze.

In the coming weeks, Year 6 will be going to the Imperial War Museum, London to learn more about World War II; Year 2 will be visiting Colchester Zoo for a unique wildlife experience and Year 5 are gearing up for an educational and fun-filled adventure at Kidzania.



The rich and varied range of these experiences reflects our commitment to providing a wellrounded and engaging education for all our children.

We are aware that winter months can be particularly challenging financially, especially with higher fuel bills and the cost of Christmas. We have successfully applied for £4000 of funding to support families during the winter months as well as our access to Food Bank vouchers.

If you or a family you know would benefit from extra support, please pop in to see myself, Mrs Thomson or Mrs Hammond.

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I have met with the site manager from Marfleet & Blyth and Essex Housing today to discuss our ongoing concerns around parking and the safety of our families coming to and from school.

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All contractors have been asked not to park on pavements and if spaces are not available in the car park, they are to park away from the site. In addition, signs have been placed around the site to reinforce this. Marfleet & Blyth have a member of staff at the entrance, and they have been asked to 'move vehicles on' if they try to park inappropriately and they are happy for parents to flag concerns directly with their staff.

In addition to this we have looked at the site today and identified an area within the construction site that will be converted into a small parking area for contractors to use. This will be ready within the next month or so and will reduce some of the vehicles parking roadside.

All parties have agreed to review the situation again when we return from the Christmas holidays.

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
