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#### **Winter Warmth Funding**

We successfully applied for additional funding from Essex council to support families during the winter months when bills are usually at their highest. #### Referral forms for outside agencies

We are seeing an increasing number of families are seeking support from external professionals and agencies for a range of reasons. To access these services parents and the school often need to provide detailed information on forms that often take over an hour to

complete each time, meaning teachers could spend a considerable amount of time each week form filling.

We have a strong record of supporting our families and communities in any way we can, but we are struggling to keep up with the extra demands the increasing number of additional forms are placing on our time. We know the information we provide other agencies is important and it is vital we make our reports as accurate as possible so our children get the levels of support they need and deserve. Therefore, whilst we will continue to complete them as soon as possible, please allow up to 12 weeks for any forms from external agencies to be completed and returned to you or the relevant agency
