<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Problem solving. Have a go at this game 'Power Lines' https://primarygames.co.uk/pg2/powerlines/powerlines1.html You need to place the numbers along each line so that they add up to the total given. Can you complete all 8 levels? ● Practise telling the time. Read to the quarter hour and the nearest 1 minute. Keep practising throughout the day, you don't need to write this down. ● Have a go at the arithmetic paper on the website. You don't have to do it as a test but work through the questions together. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Share a story together as a family. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a new chapter every day. ● Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can you change it? Can you find any synonyms for your new word? ● Book review – Write a book review about one of the books you have read so far. What is it about? Who are the characters? What was your favourite part? Was there anything you didn't like? Would you recommend it to others? What star rating would you give it?

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Practise your individual spelling lists on Spelling Shed (3x a week) ● Choose 5 Common Exception words. Write synonyms and the meaning. Can the word be changed? ● Choose 5 Common Exception words from your list. Can you write these into 5 sentences? Can you make them into one sentence? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Write a recount of your week/weekend. This could be used in history one day to show what happened during this period. Use the success criteria to help you. ● Write a character description of a member of your family. What do they look like? How do they behave? etc... Draw a picture of them to go with your writing. ● Write a letter/email/ text message to a member of their family that you have not seen this week. This is also one of our life skills in Year 4.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of their own family. Learning may focus on what different makeup of families, what traditions your family has, stories linked to your family etc.

- **Science**

Sound Survey – Take a walk around indoors and outside to identify and describe the sounds you can hear! What is making each sound? Listen carefully. Can you hear high and low sounds? Can you hear loud and quiet sounds? Fill in the table attached by describing the sound you hear.



- **Art**

Create a piece of artwork entitled 'Family'. This could be a drawing, a self-portrait, a sculpture or collage. Could you copy another artist's style (Picasso, Van Gogh)? Which materials have you chosen to use and why? How do you feel about your piece of artwork? What would you change or not?



- **History**

Who is in your child's immediate family? What other relatives do they have? How does their family link together? How many people do they have in their family? Why not spend time looking through old photos and talking about the people in their families? What family stories can they tell? How is life different to their parents' grandparents?



Make a family tree to show the different parts of your family.

- **Geography**

On a map, can you find all the **places that your family have lived**? This may need to be a world map, map of the UK or just a map of Harlow. How many countries have your parents and you **visited**? Can you make a list of these?



- **Time to Talk:**

Play a board game or card game together. Discuss your strategies with each other. Talk about your day.
