2. Charlie Bucket ate 3 bowls of cabbage soup every day of the week. How many bowls of cabbage soup is that?






3. Mr Twit added 4cm of wood to Mrs Twit's walking stick every day for 9 days. How much longer would the walking stick be at the end of 9th day?




9. There were 24 books in Matilda's school desk. Matilda had read $\frac{1}{4}$ of them. How many of the books had she read?
