It was very hard work!</p> <p>Keep going for Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday Friday.</p> <p>Write a recount about your sports day, make sure to say when you did it, use the words first, next and then. Say each sentence out loud before writing it remembering to punctuate with a capital letter and full stop.</p>	<p>Check Mathletics for daily activities</p> <p>Practice telling the time with Jack Hartman - Hip Hop Around the Clock</p> <p>Can you create your own clock including a minute (long) hand and an hour (short) hand?</p>  <p>Can you label the clocks below or draw and write your own times for o'clock and half past?</p> <p>A minute is 60 seconds. Can you count how many star jumps, sit ups and hops on one leg you can do in a minute?</p>



<p>Can you remember your first Sports Day last year in EYFS?</p> <p>What races can you remember?</p> <p>Can you look at any photos or videos and share those memories again?</p> <p>As a family can you plan your own Sports Day this week?</p> <p>What races could you have?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> egg and spoon, fancy dress, obstacle race, sprint, hopping race, three legged, hurdles, balloon race, space hopper race? <p>Pack a picnic to enjoy after the races!</p>	<p>Can you find an answer to the question:</p> <p>Which kind of step is the fastest?</p> <p>Generate different types of steps - hop, jump, giant steps, skips, side steps, galloping and practise them together.</p> <p>Can you also come up with your own step you think could be fast? Give it a name and practise it.</p> <p>Before you start - PREDICT which one you think will be the fastest.</p> <p>Then inside or outside, test the steps and collect your evidence - use stop clocks to time how long each step takes to cover a set distance that you agree.</p> <p>Record your findings in your book.</p> <p>What did you find out?</p> <p>Were your predictions correct?</p> <p>Why do they think some steps were faster than others (was one more springy, did one use bigger strides)?</p>	<p>In the London 2012 Olympics in London there were two mascots called Wenlock and Mandeville to help cheer our athletes on.</p> <p>Can you create your own mascot this week to cheer your family on at your sports day?</p> 	<p>Set yourself a challenge to get better each day at one or two of the following -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How many star jumps in one minute? How many squats in a minute? How many keepy Uppys in one minute? How many spider lunges in one minute? How many kangaroo hops? How many frog jumps? How many press ups? <p>Start on Monday, can you improve your score by Friday?</p>
